- HSCB undertook a Partnership Review on Family A following concerns raised by a family court judge in the case. The Learning Summary is available on the [HSCB website](#).
- HSCB received a presentation following a Thematic Review of SCRs and MARs since 2015. The review highlighted five key themes; Voice of the child, communication, engagement, family circumstances and supervision. Analysis of these issues and examples of good practice can be found in the [report](#).
- Following the launch of the Neglect Strategy in October 2016 HSCB has developed a [Neglect Toolkit](#) to support practitioners working with cases of neglect. Within the toolkit practitioners can access training, case study examples and tips for working with families. HSCB would like to receive feedback on the toolkit. - Following recommendations from an number of SCRs a task and finish group was commissioned to look at working with [Unidentified Adults](#) within the family. A toolkit has been produced which looks at the importance of knowing who is within the household or has caring responsibilities for a child, provides top tips for identifying and engaging with unidentified adults and individual agency flowcharts to support staff in identifying opportunities to identify unidentified adults.
- HSCB approved the updated [Learning and Improvement Framework](#). The framework underpins the work of HSCB and describes our approach to quality assurance and improvements. It supports both professionals and organisations to learn lessons and share good practice
- The [MET Strategy](#) has been updated to reflect progress and incorporate criminal exploitation of children.
